**MINUTES OF THE 13TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM) OF THE MALAYSIAN

1. Meeting Called to Order

1.1 The President, Ir. Dr Chan Swee Huat called the AGM to order at 6.05 pm when there was sufficient quorum.

2. Opening Remarks by President

2.1 Ir. Dr Chan Swee Huat welcomed the members attending the AGM and thanked them for taking the time to attend the AGM.

He further updated the AGM that the Committee had worked hard over the last one year to arrange and organized webinars as well as seminars for the benefit of MGS members. International and local experts were invited to present webinars on various topics related to Geotechnical Engineering. He took the opportunity to thank the Committee for their support and efforts throughout the session.

2.1.1 He also informed the AGM that action had been initiated on the proposals put forward at the last AGM as follows:

- i. To introduce a Corporate Associate Scheme - the scheme was launched in November 2024 and to date, 13 companies had signed up for the scheme.
- ii. To create a Members' only page in the website - the Members' Login page was completed in February 2025. Login IDs and Passwords had been sent to all members.

3. Confirmation of Minutes of the 12th Annual General Meeting

3.1 The minutes of the 11th Annual General Meeting were distributed to all members prior to the AGM via email.

3.2 The members did not have any comments on the minutes of the 12th Annual General Meeting. It was therefore proposed to be accepted by Ir. Chee Fong Wah (MGS105/17). The motion was seconded by Ir. Lo Chong Chiun (MGS15/13).

4. Secretary General's Report

4.1 The President then invited Ir. Frankie Cheah Peng Leong to present the Secretary General's Report for 2024/2025 which had been distributed to all members prior to the AGM via email.

4.2.2 The Committee held a total of 6 Committee Meetings to plan, discuss and co-ordinate the implementation of the various activities for the 2024/2025 session. The meetings were held online through video conferencing.

4.2.3 As of 31st May 2025, Malaysian Geotechnical Society had 212 registered members comprising 128 Members, 76 Associate Members, 6 Affiliate Members and 2 Student Members.

There were 10 new admissions during the session with 6 Members and 4 Associate Members. In accordance with the Constitution, 4 members and 11 Associate Members were however deleted from the register due to non-payment of annual subscriptions for two consecutive years.

7 Associate Members who had obtained their Professional Engineer registration from BEM were upgraded to the grade of Member.

The AGM was also informed that MGS had written to BEM to raise concern over the requirement by some local authorities for Geotechnical reports to be submitted to Jabatan Mineral dan Geosains for review. BEM had engaged with DBKL for discussion on this matter and it is hoped that an amicable solution would be reached soon.

- 4.2.8 MGS had signed an MoU with the Malaysian Chapter of International Geosynthetics Society (MyIGS) on 28th February 2025. The MoU will promote collaboration between MGS and MyIGS such as sharing of publications, mutual recognition for membership applications as well as attending activities of both organisations.

The MoU with IEM which was signed in 2017 was also renewed in 2024.

5.1 The President thanked Ir. Frankie Cheah for his report and invited Ir. Dr Choo Chung Siung, the Honorary Treasurer to present the financial report which had been distributed to all members prior to the AGM via email.

The AGM was informed that Surplus from Profit Sharing comprised of revenue generated from the following events:

- i. Workshop on High Strain Dynamic Pile Load Test and Seminar on Pile Testing held on 4&5 December 2023 amounting to RM34,998.66, and
- ii. 2nd GeoSS-MGS Geotechnical Conference held on 30 November - 2 December 2023 amounting to RM114,755.39

The Honorary Treasurer also reported that Income was lower in the current session due to no physical events organized. Only one physical seminar was organized i.e. on the day of the AGM and the financial statement is not ready.

In terms of expenses:

- i. Event costs was higher in the previous session due to the GeoSS-MGS Conference which was organized in Singapore. The event nevertheless brought about share of profits amounting to RM114,755.39 as reported earlier.
- ii. There was an increase in expenses for Gifts and souvenirs due to condolence wreaths sent out in memory of MGS founder and associates who had passed away during the session.
- iii. Income Tax payment was higher due to the tax that needed to be paid for the higher surplus generated in 2023.
- iv. Tax Services fee for 2024/2025 included services paid for YA 2023 and 2024 while amount paid in 2023/2024 was for YA 2022 only.

In summary, the AGM was informed that the financial performance comparison for the last two sessions were as follows:

The Honorary Treasurer also informed the AGM that the sum of cash at bank had not been placed in FD in view that MGS will be organizing the 3rd MGS-GeoSS Conference next year and preliminary payments maybe required to be paid to hotels, event contractors etc. There was however comment raised in the Committee meeting that the interest rates were very low.

The Committee is currently exploring offers from various banks to obtain the best possible revenue for the Society.

5.3 The AGM was also informed that the account had been audited by the elected Honorary Auditors for 2024/2025 session, namely Ir. Dr Ong Yin Hoe and Ir. Mak Wai Kin.

5.4 The AGM adopted the Financial Statement, as proposed by Ir. Lo Chong Chiun and seconded by Ir. Lee Peir Tien.

6. Proposed Revision to Clause 8.1 of the Constitution

Refer to **Appendix B**.

The members unanimously accepted all the proposed changes to the Statutes with comments to relook at the wordings for the new clause 6.7 on Economic Activities. The Committee were given the mandate to decide on the wordings for submission to ROS. The President agreed that this will be presented at the coming first meeting of the new Committee in July 2025.

7. Election of Committee for 2025/2026 Session

7.1 Note of Appreciation

The President, Ir. Dr Chan Swe Huat thanked the Committee Members once again for their support and efforts in running the activities of the Society for 2024/2025 session.

He then dissolved the Committee for 2024/2025 session to enable the election of new office bearers and acted as the Election Officer.

7.2 President

The AGM was informed that under provision of Clause 8.4 and 8.5 of the Statutes of the Society, the last Committee Meeting held on 29th May 2025 unanimously re-elected Ir. Dr. Chan Swee Huat as the President for 2025/2026 session.

7.3 Deputy President

The AGM also noted that at the same Committee Meeting, the Committee unanimously re-elected Ir. Dr. Gue Chang Shin as the Deputy President for 2025/2026 session, under provision of Clause 8.5 of the Statutes of the Society.

7.4 Secretary General

Ir. Lee Peir Tien proposed to re-elect Ir. Frankie Cheah Peng Leong as the Secretary General and the proposal was seconded by Ir. Dr Choo Chung Siung. As there were no other proposals, Ir. Dr Ong Ying Hoe proposed to close the nomination which was seconded by Ir. Chee Fong Wah.

The AGM then unanimously re-elected Ir. Frankie Cheah Peng Leong as the Secretary General for session 2025/2026.

7.5 Honorary Treasurer

Ir. Chee Fong Wah proposed to re-elect Ir. Dr Choo Chung Siung as the Honorary Treasurer and the proposal was seconded by Ir. Lo Chong Chiun. As there were no other proposals, Ir. Peir Tien proposed to close the nomination which was seconded by Ir. Wong Chen Jack. The AGM unanimously re-elected Ir. Dr Choo Chung Siung as the Honorary Treasurer for session 2025/2026.

9. **Concluding Remarks by President**

9.1 Ir. Dr. Chan Swee Huat thanked all Members who attended the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and assured them that more activities will be planned to benefit MGS Members in the coming term.

He also clarified that the Malaysian Geotechnical Society (MGS) was not set up to compete with the Geotechnical Engineering Technical Division (GETD) of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia (IEM). There is no intention for any rivalry between the two bodies. Instead, MGS was formed to support and complement the work of GETD by offering programmes and opportunities that a large organisation like IEM may not be able to focus on.

As an example, Dr. Chan explained the issue of membership with the International Society for Soil Mechanics and Geotechnical Engineering (ISSMGE). The membership fee is based on the total number of active members in the organisation, regardless of their field. Since IEM has a very large and diverse membership, the cost to join ISSMGE would be very high. MGS, being smaller and more focused on geotechnical engineering, would pay a much lower fee, making it more practical to be a member.

Dr. Chan also gave his assurance that MGS will continue to bring in international experts to share their knowledge, helping to make the Society more active and connected globally.

10. Meeting Adjournment

- 10.1 As there was no other matter to be discussed, the AGM was adjourned at 7.10 pm followed by a group photo session.

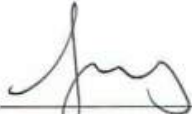

He shall in conjunction with the President and the Secretary General sign all cheques and other instruments, and authorise all electronic banking transactions and digital financial approvals, for and on behalf of the Society.</p> <p>In the absence or inability of the Honorary Treasurer, the Deputy President may act as an alternate signatory or approving authority in place of the Honorary Treasurer, provided that any such cheque, instrument, electronic transaction, or digital approval shall require the joint authorisation of the Deputy President, the President, and the Secretary General.</p>	<p>An amendment is proposed to incorporate provisions for electronic banking transactions and to introduce an alternate signatory arrangement for the Honorary Treasurer, who is currently a mandatory signatory.</p> <p>However, to ensure sound governance and to safeguard the responsibilities of the Honorary Treasurer as the officer accountable for the Society's finances, any financial document signed by the alternate signatory shall require joint authorisation by both the President and the Secretary General.</p>
